Staff Changes

We have a number of staff changes taking place at the end of this term and new appointments starting in September.

Mr Dyall and **Mrs Ali** who have both worked as teaching support staff this year, finish their temporary contracts with Uplands. **Miss Mustafa** who has been a class teacher for year 4 over the past two years also leaves this term. We have two long serving members of staff retiring from Uplands. **Mrs Helen Bull**, Office Manager retires after 22 years and **Mrs Vicky Wakelam**, Teaching Assistant, after 18 years at Uplands. Both have played a valuable role at Uplands and seen the school through many changes and inspections. Our heartfelt thanks to both of them for the dedication, enthusiasm and support that they have shown for Uplands and its pupils.

Joining us in September are **Ms Vanita Kumari** as our new Office Manager, **Ms Abigale Costigan** as a Teaching Assistant in Year 4 and **Mrs Jackie Murrin** as a Lunchtime supervisor. **Mr Joe Lyones** returns to Uplands as a class teacher in Year 5 following his teaching post in Dubai. We are pleased to welcome them all to Uplands Junior School.

School Development

The Governing Board set targets and monitors school development throughout the year. This academic year our targets focused on the Quality of Education and further development of the curriculum, pupil attendance and punctuality and personal development. Based on the progress made in these areas, the latest SAT results and new education challenges and initiatives, the board and leadership team have agreed the key areas for further development for 2024-25. Some of the main areas of focus for the next academic year are:

Quality of Education & Curriculum Development

Work has continued throughout the year on teaching plans for foundation and core subjects. In the next academic year assessment of foundation subjects and a review of the knowledge organisers will be part of the development plans for the curriculum. Uplands teaching staff will also be looking at foundation teaching plans for children with SEND to ensure that all pupils can access the full curriculum. We will continue the focus on Writing which suffered nationally from lockdown. A question by question analysis of the SAT papers and internal assessment will help to identify areas of need for all core subjects in the coming year.

Pupil Attendance and Punctuality

We are pleased to see that attendance data has improved at Uplands over the past academic year.

- Whole school attendance Sept 2022- July 2023 92.9%
- Whole school attendance Sept 2023 28th Jun 2024 95.3%

Post pandemic the national statistics showed a rise in poor attendance and punctuality in pupils of all ages. Government reports show that persistent absence impacts on achievement, wellbeing and wider development. In addition, lateness at Uplands can mean that pupils miss valuable small group teaching time some of which takes place immediately as school starts in preparation for whole class sessions. The school office, leadership team and Educational Welfare Officer will continue to work with pupils and families who struggle with punctuality and attendance as part of the national drive.

Personal Development and Behaviour

The Leadership Team are reviewing the school's approach to behaviour management with a new school policy based on restorative practice. As part of this Governors are reviewing their behaviour principles. Both will be published in the Autumn term. Restorative approaches help pupils to learn how their behaviour affects other pupils and staff. It also helps them to take responsibility and build the skills to make better choices. Staff have already undertaken some training based on the revised principles with more to come in the Autumn Term.

Pupil & Staff Wellbeing

Uplands has always held the wellbeing of staff and pupils as a top priority even prior to the pandemic. This year Mrs Webster-Smith has been working with the Wolverhampton Education Psychologist Team to audit wellbeing at Uplands as part of the Sandwell Wellbeing Charter. The outcome of the audit was very positive with a clear action plan for the next academic year.

School Bungalow

We are extremely pleased to have had the old caretakers bungalow and garden totally refurbished this term. After lying empty for some years we were finally offered financial support from the local authority. This has enabled us to convert the bungalow in to a multi-functional space which will further enhance our learning environment. Primarily this will be used for the Toast and After-school clubs with an independent access gate at the front of the school. During the school day it offers an extra break out space for teaching and learning and a meeting space for parents, governors or staff. The garden has also been landscaped and will provide a calmer space at lunch and break times for pupils and staff. It will also provide an area for more outdoor learning. The majority of work is now complete and once furnished we hope to have the building open for use early in the new term.
